



Things to Think About

As you listen to the broadcast, consider the following questions:


- **What types of careers interest you? • Do any of the speakers mention jobs that align with your passions or skills?**
- **What qualifications do these careers require? • What is the work environment like?**
- **Will you need to continue with further education or consider an apprenticeship?**
- **Does it sound like something you would enjoy? • Are there opportunities for growth or advancement?**
- **Does this pathway offer the potential for career progression?**

Prompt Questions:

- **What qualifications or skills do I need to start working in this field?**
- **How do I know if an apprenticeship/T-level/vocational course/A-Levels/University is the right path for me?**
- **Are there specific subjects I should focus on in school to prepare for this career?**
- **How long does it typically take to complete a qualification in this field?**
- **What are some of the challenges in this career pathway, and how can I prepare for them?**
- **Are there opportunities for work experience while studying or training? • What does a typical day look like?**
- **Are there specific skills that are in high demand in your industry right now?**
- **How important is a degree versus hands-on experience in your field?**
- **How do you see your industry changing in the next 5-10 years?**



Next Steps

Now that you've learned about different pathways and opportunities, think about what your next steps could be. Use this section to outline actions you can take after the broadcast to explore your options further.

- 1. Research:** What more can you find out about the pathways that interested you? Are there websites, brochures, or people you can talk to for more information? *Example: Visit the website of a provider that interested you or look into apprenticeship opportunities in an industry that was discussed.*
- 2. Speak to Your Careers Lead/Advisor:** Schedule a meeting with your school's careers lead/advisor to discuss what you learned today and how it might influence your choices for subjects or next steps after KS3/4. *Example: Ask about how to pursue the qualifications or training mentioned in the broadcast.*
- 3. Explore Pathways Further:** Think about visiting open days, attending career fairs, or shadowing a professional to gain a deeper understanding of a career that excites you. *Example: Sign up for an upcoming careers event or ask if you can tour a college or training provider.*
